Medicaid leads to better health outcomes for Kansans. Hardworking Kansans deserve a fair shot. Life happens—jobs are lost, accidents occur, and not every job offers insurance. Everyone deserves the chance to see a doctor when they need care. Consider how cuts to Medicaid would impact our children, seniors, rural communities, and the business climate in Kansas.



Kansas Children:

Parents losing coverage leads to children losing coverage and stops them from getting the care they need. 31% of all births in Kansas are covered by Medicaid.



Hard Working Kansans and Businesses:

A healthy workforce makes Kansas a business-friendly state. Investing in health care access helps employees stay productive while easing the burden on small businesses to provide insurance. It's a win for workers, businesses, and all of Kansas. Investments in health care access support hard-working Kansans stuck in jobs that don't offer health insurance. These are people who pay taxes, contribute to our economy, and pay their bills, yet still cannot afford healthcare. Investing in health care access ensures they can stay healthy and continue contributing to our economy.



Cuts affect Kansas' Rural Communities:

Hospitals and healthcare providers—especially rural hospitals—depend on Medicaid. Sudden cuts can lead to hospital closures, fewer services, and higher costs for uninsured patients. 63 rural hospitals are in immediate risk of closure. Of those, 26 are in immediate risk of closure. 12% of rural seniors and 32% of rural communities are enrolled in Medicaid.



Kansas Nursing Home Residents:

People with heart disease management, stroke rehabilitation, or preventive care need Medicaid. 4 out of 7 nursing home residents are covered by Medicaid.
